Guidelines for Junior Expository

An Expository speech is an original speech written with the goal of informing, persuading, and/or entertaining with the use of visual aids.

RULES:

- 1. Each speech must be original to the student. A maximum of 30% of the total speech can be directly quoted from other sources.
- 2. Memorization is required.
- 3. All types of visual aids are allowed <u>except weapons</u>. Students may use electronic devices but must provide their computer, or other applicable device.
- 4. Students will have two minutes to set up their visual aids before speaking. They must do all set-up and break-down of their visual aids by themselves.
- 5. Costumes are allowed but must be put on and taken off during the course of the speech.
- 6. An average presentation time limit of 5 minutes is encouraged but not required. No student will be penalized for going over or under the suggested time.
